
**Session 1:** Friday, October 8 from 6:30 to 8 p.m. via Zoom.

#### Stewardship Campaign 2022 — Let's Do This Together!

"Differences are not intended to separate, to alienate. We are different precisely in order to realize our need of one another." — Africa's Peace Bishop, Desmond Tutu

The COVID-19 pandemic closed our church campus for most of 2020 and half of 2021. It kept us struggling to maintain our identity as a church. To fight the isolation many of us felt, some among us delivered meals, cards and friendly prayers for our homebound church kin. We learned new skills like videoconferencing so small groups could challenge the sense of disconnection that sometimes crept into our hearts. We also joined with one another and our neighboring community in new ways to help meet the needs of families and individuals facing hardships from the impact COVID-19 has had on jobs, housing, and health. God has blessed us with resilience as a church because we found ways to preserve the unity we cherish.

Debate lives among us, too. Even as we love one another, we have had to choose how to grow as a church in the last year or so. After animated examination of Methodist tradition and personal introspection, we overwhelmingly chose to identify ourselves as a Reconciling Church.

This year, our stewardship campaign takes the initiative to follow the example of "Africa's Peace Bishop." Bishop Tutu reminds us that we at San Ramon Valley United Methodist Church believe our differences and acceptance of everyone for who they are bind us together in community. We support each other—including you—by looking outward to be disciples of Jesus Christ in the world regardless of where you are on your own Discipleship Pathway (visit <a href="https://srvumc.org/the-trail/">https://srvumc.org/the-trail/</a> to consider where you are on The Trail).

The church's work has always relied on your gifts and generous support as a big-hearted congregation. After the difficulties we have endured these past fifteen months, we need your financial support more than ever. Livestreaming video requires equipment, for example, and certain remodeling tasks keep us safer while on the church campus. This year, our stewardship campaign starts in early October, as we are hoping to reach a pledge goal that supports all of our important ministries by year end. That did not happen in 2021. 

The East Bay is home for one of the largest Afghan populations in the US (Source: <u>KQED.org</u>). In September, Jewish Family and Community Services East Bay expected to help resettle more than 60 people fleeing Afghanistan (source: <u>The Mercury News online</u>).

#### **Your CA-NV Conference Responds**

The Conference Disaster Response Ministry operated six days in September at the Local Assistance Center in Placerville. Led by the Conference Early Response Team, we assisted evacuees with gift cards for immediate needs, emergency hygiene kits, wildfire recovery equipment and cleaning supplies.

We gave away about \$20,000 worth of gift cards, kits and supplies. The vast majority of this assistance was funded by the Conference Disaster Response Fund or donated by United Methodist Churches in the California-Nevada Conference. We also handed out gift cards, hygiene kits and wildfire buckets to the two local churches for ongoing support.

### **World Communion Sunday**

Six churchwide special Sundays mark the United Methodist calendar, and each year, the United Methodist Church celebrates World Communion Sunday on the first Sunday of October. This year, **October 3** will be the day our own church joins with other Christians from a range of denominations to celebrate our unity.

In 2020, the United Methodist Church collectively gave \$400,254 towards the ministries funded by the World Communion Sunday offering. This offering supports a diverse mix of national and international ethnic young adults to make a global impact for Christ. Half of the offering benefits World Communion Scholarships for graduate students from the US and other countries; the remainder assists Ethnic Scholarships for US and international undergraduates studying in the US and Ethnic In-Service Training. These funds are administered by the <a href="General Boards">General Boards</a> of Higher Education and Ministry and Global Ministries.

World Communion Sunday began in 1936 to celebrate our ecumenical oneness in Christ with a spirit of unity and peace. In The United Methodist Church, the Sunday offering collected that day funds scholarships and mentoring for students from around the world.

- Full vaccination (COVID-19).
- Recent (within twelve months) negative TB test and medical clearance form on file. Katelyn can send this form to anyone interested.
